2011 Dominique Cornin

Located just outside the village of Chaintre is the small domaine of Dominique Cornin, one of several Cornins in this locale. They sold their crop to the co-operative up until 1993. Everything here is estate grown, the vines certified organic and the wines matured in stainless steel (for the Macon) and in demi-muids, which Romain Cornin informed me is the preferred vessel. This was my last visit of the week and I wished that I did not have to run and catch my flight home, for these were very succinct, traditional, terroir-driven wines that prioritize finesse over power or richness. "Less is more" might be the mantra here.

91 PTS | 2011 Pouilly-Fuisse les Chevrieres

The 2011 Pouilly-Fuisse Les Chevrieres comes from the top of the hill in Chaintre where there is only 10cm of ferrous soil before the limestone bedrock. It is matured only in demi-muids. It has a strict, linear bouquet with very fine mineralite – expressing the terroir very well. The palate is again, strict and almost Zen-like with crisp acidity and a lovely, focused stony finish.

90 PTS | 2011 Pouilly-Fuisse Clos Reyssie

The 2011 Pouilly-Fuisse Clos Reyssie comes from a bona fide clos with more clayey soils than Cornin's other cuvees. It has a fragrant, nicely defined bouquet with touches of white peach and brioche. The palate is a little fuller than the other Pouilly-Fuisse wines from Cornin thanks to maturation in the Burgundy barrel, but the finish has fine definition and tension. Very fine.

89 PTS | 2011 Pouilly-Fuisse les Plessys

The 2011 Pouilly-Fuisse Les Plessys comes from a single parcel and is half aged in demi-muid. It has an attractive bouquet with apple blossom and nectarine scents that gain intensity in the glass. The palate is well-balanced with touches of white peach and nectarine, the acidity nicely judged with an elegant, peach-tinged finish that lingers nicely in the mouth.

88 PTS | 2011 Macon-Chaintre Serreudieries

The 2011 Macon-Chaintre Serreudieries is a single parcel bottling. It has a delightful light white peach and citrus-scented bouquet that is well-defined. The palate is bright and lively on the entry with delicate peach notes and hints of brioche and grilled almond on the finish. This is a step up from the Macon-Chaintre and is well worth seeking out.

88 PTS | 2011 Saint Veran Serreudieries

The 2011 Saint Veran Serreudieries, which comes from the same hill (at the top) as the Macon-Chaintre, has a lifted apple blossom and nectarine scented bouquet with fine delineation. The palate is fresh and crisp on the entry with pointed citric acidity and a stony-edged finish. Fine.

86 PTS | 2011 Pouilly-Fuisse

The 2011 Pouilly-Fuisse comes from several tiny plots around Chaintre with just a 2 to 3% smattering of oak. It has an elegant bouquet, quite floral with hints of orange blossom and apricot that is well-defined and very floral. The palate is well-balanced with an uncomplicated citrus entry. It boasts a crisp, almost racy line of acidity but it just tapers away a little toward the finish. I would be intrigued to taste other vintages.

85 PTS | 2011 Macon-Chaintre

The maiden 2011 Macon-Chaintre is a blend of four small parcels. It offers a light apple blossom nose with fine definition if not quite the vigor. The palate is light with green apple and pear, a fine thread of acidity and a light, straightforward finish. Acceptable, if not spectacular.

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The Mâconnais: The White Burgundy You Can Afford

Had you been strolling through the quaint seaside village of "Old Leigh" on a scorching summer's evening circa June 2005, you would have noticed a wedding party in full swing up on the balcony of Leigh-on-Sea Sailing Club and a rabble of inebriates caterwauling something resembling Starship's epochal "Nothing's Gonna Stop Us Now" across the Thames Estuary.

"They seem to be having a jolly time," you think to yourself. "They must be drinking something nice."

You would be correct. While I cannot deny that a case of Château Trotte Vieille had been secreted inside for more discerning palates and a 1955 Château Margaux for bride and groom, most guests were blithely glugging their way through cases of Mâcon from the Jean-Marie Guffens at an alarming rate.

Why *that* particular wine?

Well, because I was well-acquainted with the quality of Monsieur Guffen's wines, which were both delicious and suited to a minuscule budget like mine. And to be frank, that has not changed - Mâcon itself certainly has. Eight years on, it is an opportune moment to examine this oft-overlooked region since it could be on the brink of a defining era, one where its most propitious climats will be as familiar and as coveted as those in the Côte d'Or. It is time to expand your horizons beyond those golden slopes and embrace the Mâconnais, the vinous delights it has to offer.

The Land

You can look at the Mâconnais two ways. You can take a bird's eye view of the entire, somewhat disjointed region whose boundaries contain over 5,639 hectares of vineyard and which "churns out" 298,999 hectoliters of white and 25,004 hectoliters of red wine each year (BIVB figures - 2008). Then we can begin focusing upon the multitudinous Mâcon-Village designations, which can be labeled "Mâcon-Villages" or "Mâcon-" appended by commune name, for example, Mâcon-Fuissé or Mâcon-Vinzelles. A decree passed in September 2005 reduced the number of communes entitled to append their name from over 40 to a more manageable 26. Latest figures from the BIVB show that in 2012 there are 3,345 hectares designated Mâcon-Villages that produced 229,815 hectoliters. Just like anywhere else, each village commune will have its own personality depending on *terroir*. Broadly speaking, those toward the east such as Uchizy tend to ripen earlier, while those toward the northern flank such as La Roche-Vineuse tend to ripen a little later; others tucked away into the hills and valleys toward the west vary depending upon the contours of the land.

We can then zone in upon specific appellations within the Mâconnais: St. Véran, Viré-Cesse, Pouilly-Fuissé, Pouilly-Vinzelles and Pouilly-Loché. Of those, Pouilly-Fuissé is the most renowned, so we should spend a little time examining this region.

The appellation of Pouilly-Fuissé expands over 761 hectares (2011/12 figures - BIVB) and covers four communes: Chaintré, Fuissé, Solutré-Pouilly and Vergisson. In his essential tome "Inside Burgundy" Jasper Morris points out that in "*Topographie de Tous les Vignobles Connus*" (1866), Jullien designated "Fuissé" as first class, Chaintré, Solutré and Davayé second, Vergisson, Vinzelles and Loché third. That classification has some credence today though the reputations of Vergisson, Solutré and Vinzelles are certainly ascendant.



It is a picturesque, tranquil, perhaps pastoral vista as one drives toward Fuissé from the town of Mâcon. The rolling hills are punctured by two rocky bluffs: "Roche de Vergisson" and to its south, the "Mont de Pouilly," all looking as if someone tore the canvas of the Earth's crust to expose its complex substrata. Under the schistous soils lies Bathonian or Bajocian limestone, though a myriad of fault-lines and consequential geological variations influence the wines in their own particular ways and therefore each *lieu-dit* has its say on the eventual wine. As we shall see, it is probably a good time to get to know your "Chataigniers" from your "Vers Cras," your "Vignes Blanches" from "Les Insarts."

Chaintré contains well-exposed south and east-facing vineyards with limestone-clay soils over Bajocian limestone, the best *lieux-dits* tending to be Les Verchères and Aux Quarts. The village of Pouilly actually lies in the commune of Solutré and the *terroir* is not dissimilar to that of Fuissé. However, there has tended to be less domaine-bottling in this commune, so its name is only just coming to prominence. Vergisson contains higher and cooler vineyards; a feature that Morris suggests is coming into their favor in the light of global warming. There is a clutch of coveted *climats* here: En Buland, Aux Charmes, Les Crays, La Maréchaude and La Roche. The 43 hectares of Pouilly-Vinzelles is predominantly located on an east-facing and relatively steep incline, its most well-known *climats* "Les Longeays" and "Les Quarts," where Domaine de la Soufrandière is located (see Bret Brothers). Finally, Pouilly-

Loché is probably the least familiar commune. It is one of the smallest at just 32 hectares and its wines can and frequently are sold under Pouilly-Vinzelles.

I will briefly summarize two other important appellations of the Mâconnais.

St-Véran is so-called because it was felt that appellations ought to bear the name of a saint and it came into being as recently as 1971. Extending from the Petite Grosne river down to the village of Leynes, its 703 hectares are located in two "islands" that surround Pouilly-Fuissé: six communes to its north and four to the south. The western side of the hills contains older rock of scree-covered grey marl while those on the eastern side are from younger strata of marly limestone with clayey loam soils. Climats of note include Les Chailloux, La Côte-Rôtie (which apparently has only recently raised the heckles of the citizens of the Northern Rhône, in which case maybe the Mâconnais should request that the world desist using "Chardonnay"?), Les Pommards, Les Cras and La Grande Bruyère.

The wines of Viré-Clessé were highly regarded during the 19th century. According to Jasper Morris, Viré declined delimitation in 1937 when the other appellations were being designated because they did not want to pay higher taxes. It was only in 1963 that the first request for its own appellation was received from Viré and not until 1998 that the appellation came into being, albeit combined with that of Clessé since it was felt their *terroirs* bore similarities. The best climats tend to be L'Epinet and La Verchère.

The Poor Man's Chablis?

If we perceive Côte d'Or as the heart of Burgundy flanked by two major wine regions, Chablis to the north and the Mâconnais to the south, then we should ask why the former has become so recognized and revered, while the latter languishes in the sidelines and is only now beginning to extricate itself from its reputation as a source of mass-produced Chardonnay and with the exception of Pouilly-Fuissé, the "poor man's Chablis."

Firstly, it is because for so many years the region was dominated by co-operatives that prioritized quantity over quality. That is rational since large enterprises suit, what in Burgundian terms, is a huge region producing a vast amount of generic wine. In the Côte d'Or the trend of growers bottling their own wines, escalating land prices and the hierarchy of *climats* have conspired to push co-operatives into a corner, whereas in the Mâconnais they continue to rule the roost. The trend for Mâconnais growers to strike for independence has gathered momentum since the 1990s, however it still lags some years behind the Côte d'Or. Appraising the co-operative current releases against independent producers, did I find a large gap in quality? I will answer that later.

The second reason is that the INAO has never blessed/burdened Mâcon with an official hierarchy. The current state of play is that there are no Premier Crus and this has been construed as a reflection of quality. How come Montagny burgeons with Premier Crus and yet not a solitary Premier Cru vine resides in Mâcon? This has precluded Mâcon of the kudos rightly or wrongly bestowed upon the *climats* in the Côte d'Or.

The 2011 vintage came after a particularly wintery December followed by more benign conditions from January to March. April was unseasonably warm which meant that the growing season galloped 3 weeks ahead of schedule following ideal flowering.

An early harvest was in the offing.

However, the growing cycle was impeded by arid conditions and hydric stress that particularly affected the young vines and then overcast and showery July and August put the brakes on and chef de culture had to watch out for mildew. The pickers were eventually sent out with their secateurs toward the end of August, depending upon the vagaries of the parcel, and natural sugar levels came out between a decent 11 to 13 percent with relatively high pH levels.

Mâcon: A New Chapter

Mâconnais wines continue to offer unbeatable values at times. I simultaneously authored this report and one on Burgundy 2011s and I recall on one morning receiving two e-mails for suggested retail prices in the United States. One contained numbers that reached over \$800.00 per bottle and the other, for one of Fuissé's top artisans peaked at \$50.00 per bottle. I don't need to tell you where each related. While there has and always will be a price differential, the figures for two Chardonnay wines lying upon propitious *terroirs* now seem irrational and with economic travails continuing, the Mâconnais has a huge opportunity to entice disaffected Burgundy-lovers to a more affordable alternative, one with a bright future.

The Mâconnais is changing. Make no mistake - this is a dynamic region awakening to its potential. Increasing numbers of growers are finding their own voices through their own wines hitherto blended away by co-operatives, winnowing out their finest *terroirs* and translating the results into separate domaine-bottlings with multiple cuvées.

What makes it even more exciting is the fact that dossiers have already been dispatched by the I.N.A.O. as part of an ongoing process toward classifying potential Premier Crus within Pouilly-Fuissé in four or five year's time. Hundreds of excavations have been dug to analyze sub-soils and historical documents examined to ascertain which *climats* were regarded as most propitious. Interestingly, the growers demonstrated a consensus of where the Premier Crus ought to be awarded and they voiced strong opinions that it should be limited to between 15% and around 20% of the total vineyard area.

"I am definitely in favor of premiers crus in Pouilly Fuissé, provided they are sensibly organized and not too extensive," remarked Jasper Morris. "It looks as though these conditions are being met, but there may yet be opposition from the Côte d'Or which could make the project hard to push through. Personally I would wait ten years for St Véran to see how Pouilly-Fuissé beds down."

There are pitfalls of course. Politics will surely come into play, if not now then at some point. The co-operatives must surely fear a similar trend in the Côte d'Or whereby they will be denied the best vineyards for their brands. Of course, it does present some impetus for them to winnow the best *climats* themselves, charging a premium rather than blending it into a large volume label. However, one can argue that this will not benefit the region in the same way that it has done further north.

And that respect is long overdue. Those Cistercian monks were not so naïve as to overlook the potential of Mâcon and it is close to here that their abbey in Cluny is located.

The Mâconnais, Ready to Deliver

During my week in Macon, I tasted 400 samples in the offices of the Maison de Bourgogne under single blind conditions that as always, proved an illuminating exercise. (Readers should note that I type my impressions directly onto my laptop in what you might call "real time," therefore they read in that manner.) In addition, I conducted numerous visits to growers where I got a feel of the region in conversation with *vignerons*, walking through their vineyards to inspect the complex mosaic of *terroirs* "up close and personal" and simply spending moments watching the weather interact with this beautiful landscape.

What I learned throughout my sojourn was this. The apotheosis of Mâconnais wine stands shoulder to shoulder with those of the Côte d'Or. If you were to pin me down, perhaps contending with a mid-ranking Premier Cru at its very best. Slip a top-notch Pouilly-Fuissé into a line-up of preening Chardonnays from the Côte de Beaune and just watch your professional critic slip over their preconceptions because you can bet your bottom dollar that the tip-top Mâcon would embarrass several hallowed Premier Cru and perhaps even the occasional slipshod Grand Cru.

"The quality in the Mâconnais is clearly a significant step up from where it was a generation ago when it was all about mass-produced co-operative wine," commented Jasper Morris. "Now there are a decent number of progressive producers making exciting wines from distinct *terroirs* which have much greater potential for me than almost anywhere in the Côte Chalonnaise."

That is a sentiment with which I would certainly concur. Chardonnay is a grape variety that provides a blank canvas upon which either the terroir or the winemaker or indeed both can draw a personality, if they wish for something more than quaffing commercial fare. Given the maturity of many of the most propitious parcels of vine, often over half-a-century in age and even up to 100 years old, then that should certainly be the goal for any aspiring vigneron.

In the Mâconnais, I feel that it is the duty of the winemaker to really take their hands off the wheel, consider their responsibility to uphold thoughtful vineyard husbandry, pick precisely without recourse to machines and then to simply shepherd the wines through élevage. That implies a minimalist approach with prudent bâtonnage and careful use of new oak barrels if any at all. At its best, I feel that top performing Mâconnais wines need no more than between zero and say, 15% new oak. Here, I feel the Chardonnay is more impressionable than in the Côte d'Or, where the intensity of fruit allows winemakers to use more wood, whether used or new. In the Mâconnais, I feel that is ill-advised and there is absolutely nothing wrong with a simple few months in stainless steel vats to let the *terroir* do all the talking, because it often has much to say.

To temper my enthusiasm for Mâconnais wines, I am not totally convinced by their ability to age. While I found occasional examples that aged with panache and reward those with the patience to cellar bottles, for example from Château de Fuissé, Domaine de la Croix Senaillet, Bret Brothers and Olivier Merlin, I found many of the bottles with extended aging submitted for the blind tasting failed to make a case for longevity. Many of these wines should be consumed within their first two or three years in order to relish those precocious scents and flavors of youth, therefore I have refrained from stating drinking windows unless I have my own positive experience of mature examples.

Speaking to Dominique Lafon, a man who can speak with more first-hand experience than most on the subject, he seemed sanguine about the subject of longevity. He opined that practically all except the pinnacle merit cellaring, a view with which I concur. The reality is that the wines tend not to reward you with anything inherently superior to what you tucked away all those years ago, what I sometimes refer to as "zero interest wines" (in banking terms, not one's enthusiasm!) There are exceptions and you might rejoinder that few Côte d'Or Chardonnays truly repay cellaring. However, it is more something to consider in terms of the regions' reputations vis-à-vis appellations such as Chassagne-Montrachet or Meursault.

Also, I could muster little enthusiasm for the small number of red Mâconnais wines that tended to be a little raw and scrawny, with only one or two exceptions. Perhaps that might explain why red vineyard holdings contracted from a peak of 771 hectares in 2000/01 to 522 hectares in 2011/12. Given the superb quality of the top Gamay teaming out of Beaujolais at the moment, I would keep the Mâconnais blinkered on Chardonnay.

There are some that still produce late-picked Chardonnay that have turned slightly pink in colour, known locally as *levrouté*, with residual sugar levels to appease undiscerning palates, something that winemakers such as Olivier Merlin and Dominique Lafon abhor. Indeed, the latter mentioned his preference for picking at around 12 to 12.5% alcohol in order to maintain freshness. I too disliked many of these wines that seemed passé compared to their peers, the sweetness obfuscating the *terroir* and personality of the region. Nor did I find age improving these wines that tended to be five or six years old. If anything, age left them rather muddled and occasionally anonymous.

As my report makes clear, it is incorrect to brand all Mâconnais co-operatives as "stack 'em high/sell 'em cheap" concerns. One pleasing find, one that you could argue can only be accomplished through blind tasting, is the worthiness of the Cave Co-operative de Lugny's portfolio when pitted against artisan producers. As I have mentioned with respect to Rioja, co-operatives are ambassadors, the conduit through which the masses judge a region and coalesce conceptions. It is perhaps for this very reason that Chablis enjoys such a high profile while Mâcon is only just beginning to find its own voice. I was more disappointed by the standard of offerings from Beaujolais and Burgundy-based merchants, with the exception of Maison Champy. I suspect one or two are exploiting Mâcon as a source of suitable low price points rather than quality. Ergo, as has been traditionally the case, Mâcon is regarded as a source of easy drinking, quaffing wine - the poor man's Burgundy. It can be, but that is riding roughshod over its exceptional terroir and keeping Mâcon in second gear.

Jasper Morris also cautioned that the Mâconnais must not give into the temptation to run before they can walk...

"There is scope to grow this in the future but prosperity is fragile," he explained. "Too many domaines have been caught up in a negative spiral, in which diminishing returns have led to corners being cut, thus in due course lesser quality and so even more difficulty in getting the necessary price in the market place."

But the Mâconnais has a burgeoning number of winemakers who are expressing the minutiae of their land with increasing style, class and *typicité*. Like Chablis, the dominance of mono-varietal wines coupled with a straightforward approach to vinification revealed the nuances between the various *climats* and often ensured that Mâcon offers an intellectual as well as sensorial exercise.

I think back to my nuptials on that summer's day eight years ago. You might ask me whether I would choose another Chardonnay, something with more kudos, something worthy of the most important day in your life, perchance a Premier Cru from Meursault or Chassagne-Montrachet, even a nice crisp St. Aubin. And the answer, following my week in Mâcon and having tasted Jean-Marie Guffens' wines, is that I would order exactly the same wine again. Hey, and maybe even the same girl.
